The mission with various objectives of the college stated in the citizen’s charter of the institution is as follows:

To impart under graduate and post graduate level education in Arts, Commerce, Science and Physical Education to the local rural population.

To fulfil the need of higher education in the local villages in periphery which are economically, socially and educationally backward and scarcely have any access of higher education.

To provide physical education and sports facility to the students, and to Make available opportunities to participate in inter college/ inter university/ state level and national level tournaments. Institute aims to soar high in Matter of national and international sports and games with the limited available resources.

To create environmental awareness among the students and to inculcate them in the methods of ecological conservation.



To unfold the creative aspects of personality of students, the institution provides them opportunities at the college level to participate in social and cultural activities along with educational aptitude.

Keeping in view the above facts, the college has been working with the team spirit and the college has been trying hard to achieve goals and objectives.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum is developed by the University and the institute is implementing it. The Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur is preparing the curriculum and syllabus of the different courses through their respective board of studies

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

College is strictly adhered with the yearly calendar provided by the Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur and Chhattisgarh Higher Education Department.

Every year College program wise prepare the timetable.

Institute ensures the regular classes as per the timetable.

There is paucity of regular teaching faculties; but, institute has no right to appoint the regular teacher. The Chhattisgarh Higher Education Department (CGHED) is sole responsible to appoint the Assistant Professors through Chhattisgarh Public Service Commission against the sanctioned post allotted to the college. The college appoints the Guest-Lecturers by the order of CGHED every year against the sanctioned post of Assistant Professors in various subjects.

After appointment of Guest Lecturers to permeate the teachers as per the ratio of students, College "Jan Bhagidari Samiti" appoints temporary teachers for various subjects to complete the stipulated lectures shown in time table as per the syllabus.

The Regular Faculty members are giving priority to deliver lectures to the post graduate classes and first year under graduate Students.



6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

In Examination the paper setting and evaluating the papers are the solitary concern of the Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (PRSU), Raipur. The college is the centre for the conduction of the examination. College receives the paper from PRSU; conducting the examination as per the examination timetable set by the PRSU and after completion of the examination answer sheets of the students were handed over to the PRSU for evaluation and result declaration.

As per the statutes and ordinances of PRSU for various programs the college is submitting internal Marks to the PRSU as per the mechanism for continuous evaluation of the academic sessions running throughout the year. In this Internal Marks the attendance, Marks of unit tests and seminar/assignments were considered.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The core funding agency for development of infrastructure and instrumentation in the college is Chhattisgarh Government through Chhattisgarh Higher Education Department and University Grants Commission.

College has a library with 19,548 titles managed by a competent and skilled librarian. Library has a separate building with basic amenities.

For minor repairing of infrastructure and equipments, to purchase minor equipments and to purchase furniture the college local committee "*Jan Bhagidari Samiti*" provides funds which was helpful to cater the increasing demand of this progressive college.

Information and Computer Technology is not much established in the college. But, College is seeking help from the funding agencies to develop the ICT facilities.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

There is paucity of regular teaching faculties and administrative staff; After appointment of Guest Lecturers to permeate the teachers as per the ratio of students, College "*Jan Bhagidari Samiti*" (JBS) appoints temporary teachers for various subjects to complete the stipulated lectures shown in time table as per the syllabus. Also JBS gives support to appoint the temporary appointment for Class III (Data Entry Operator, Clerk, Accountant, Laboratory Technician, Store Keeper, etc.) and Class IV (Peon, Booklifter, Laboratory Attendants, etc.) employees for very short periods (less than one year or for some months as per work load in a specific time).

The sanctioning of post, selection and appointment of the Class III (Data Entry Operator, Clerk, Accountant, Laboratory Technician, Store Keeper, etc.) and Class IV (Peon, Booklifter, Laboratory Attendants, etc.) employees are the exclusive right of Chhattisgarh Higher Education Department.

Assistant Professors through Chhattisgarh Public Service Commission against the sanctioned post (by CGHED) allotted to the college.
